The content of the lectures is transmitted through the use of such teaching methods as a conventional lecture, problem lecture and conversational lecture. Teaching methods used to implement the thematic scope of the classes include work with literature, multiple discussion, classic problem-solving method.

The correct presentation, ability to answer questions about the presented material.
